Jim was outstanding and distinguished in: Slow Pitch softball as a Pitcher, Catcher, Infielder, Outfielder and his outstanding and distinguished skills were in Speed/Quickness, Hitting Abilities, Defense Skills and Sportsman/Gamesmanship.

Jim was known best for: Being the vocal leader on and off the field for all the teams he played for. He was usually the 2nd batter in the order and you could consistently record a line drive single or double next to his name. In crunch time you could count on a home run from him.

Statistics, Awards & Accomplishments: Jim played on 3 teams that finished in the top 3 at the State Level. His team took 2nd Place in the Bloomington Invitational and Round Barn Tournament where he was also named the Most Valuable Player. He was selected to the All-Tournament Team @ Midwest Regional in Louisville and was the leading hitter in Seymour @ State Tourney (15 hits/17 @ bats). Jim also played on the Major Open State Champion team in Michigan (Michiana Merchants).

Jim's contributions to the game made a difference: Without thinking about his contributions on the field, he has made maybe a bigger contribution off the field. For the last 37 years Jim has been Manager of Operations for the South Bend Parks & Recreation Department In the position he has maintained softball diamonds for the city. His greatest accomplishment was the creation of the renowned Belleville Softball Complex for which he was the Project Foreman.

Donna Dandino

Donna was outstanding and distinguished in: Playing both Fast Pitch and Slow Pitch Softball as an Infielder. Her outstanding and distinguished skills were in Speed/Quickness, Hitting Abilities, Defense Skill, Sportsman/Gamesmanship, Manager/Coach and Ambassador/Teacher.

Donna was known best for: Being a team leader on and off the field for all teams that she played on and managed.

Statistic, Awards & Accomplishments: City Champion in Women's League for 16 out of 20 years where there were 30 teams in the league. City Champions in the Co-Ed League – twice. Represented Indiana in the Midwest Regional in 1996, and in the 35 and older National in 2002 at the age of 44. She participated in 10 Women's & Co-Ed State Tournaments.

Donna's contributions to the game made a difference: Donna changed the face of Women's Softball in our region. She was a great defensive short stop and hit over 500. She was one of the first women's fast pitch players to move to the slow pitch area and add to its popularity and growth in Northern Indiana. In addition – in her spare time she coached high school softball at St. Joseph and Washington High Schools. After retiring from playing and coaching she has remained active as a seasonal maintenance grounds crew member at Belleville Softball Complex.

He then came down to the third floor and saw how the fire props worked and experienced for himself how difficult it is to actually see in a fire. He ended his time by deploying a hoseline and putting out a vehicle fire. Mayor Pete was present to assist Senator Donnelly.


