Dear Neighbor,

With water quality very much in the national news, I'd like to take a moment to express my appreciation for the excellence of our Water Works staff here in South Bend. By nature, when this work goes well, it goes unnoticed. Yet it is absolutely essential to making sure this is a city where everyone can thrive.

The data available in the most recent 2014 Consumer Confidence Report confirms that our rigorous treatment and testing protocols are resulting in top-quality tap water that meets or exceeds all standards set by the federal government.

South Bend releases this water quality report each summer because we believe our customers are empowered by having all the information about their drinking water and how the City assures its safety and availability 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

We make this happen through continuous treatment, testing, and monitoring, and it begins with 30 water-production wells that pump quality groundwater from more than 100 feet below to the surface. We follow that with treatment at the City's drinking water facilities, and we maintain almost 600 of miles of pipes to make sure the water gets to residents safely and efficiently.

One of our most important tools in every step of the process is sophisticated testing of our water before and after it goes through the system. South Bend Water Works conducts laboratory tests on groundwater, water being treated, and water being sent to homes, schools, and businesses. South Bend goes beyond the level of testing required by regulations, allowing us to keep tabs on the quality of one of our most precious resources.

Though lots of work goes into ensuring water quality, our goal is that you can take safe drinking water for granted. Please check our website if you'd like more information on our ongoing commitment to providing residents with the highest level of assurance every time we turn on our taps.

From the Office of the City Clerk

The City of South Bend reminds residents and business owners that they are responsible for the removal of any snow and ice that accumulates on the sidewalks immediately adjacent to their property within 24 hours after snow has fallen or accumulated (Sec. 20-102). City officials also encourage residents to help their neighbors and relatives who have difficulty removing snow from their sidewalks. Without clear paths through snow and ice, it is especially difficult for people with disabilities, the elderly, and children to walk safely.

During prolonged snowstorms, it may be necessary for the Mayor to issue a Residential Snow Removal Condition to clear snow from streets curb to curb. When a Residential Snow Removal Condition is declared, residents are to park on the even side of a street on even-numbered days, and on the odd side of a street on odd-numbered days. All other parking restrictions will be lifted at such times. Residents who are in violation of the parking restrictions when the ordinance is in effect may receive a \$25 fine (Sec. 20-105).


