Dear Neighbor,

City parks and recreation centers offer more than facilities for residents to exercise and enjoy nature. As important as those things are, parks and recreation centers have a more important function: to unite communities.

Anyone who has spent a weekend afternoon at LaSalle Park, splashed around at Potawatomi pool, attended a concert at Seitz Park, or ice skated at Howard Park understands that impact of those places goes far beyond the activities themselves. That's why we're implementing a plan to enhance what the South Bend Parks and Recreation department has to offer.

In 2014, the City oversaw the development of a five-year master plan that outlined maintenance, equipment, and capital needs to modernize South Bend's parks system. In early 2015, the Common Council passed \$5 million in bonds to finance improvements. This summer, we're beginning to see the results of those efforts.

A new dog park opened on Niles Avenue, and a new basketball court was dedicated at Kennedy Park, which will also receive new playground equipment later this summer. Freemont Park and Kelly Park also will have a new basketball court and new playground equipment soon. Additional improvements to the Charles Black Center and Howard Park Ice Rink are on the horizon as well.

And we're excited to announce the opening of the Aerial Adventure Course at South Bend's Rum Village Park in mid-August. The course will feature a network of zip lines, walking bridges and tightropes suspended above the ground. The course offers 60 separate platforms and challenging ways for people to get from one platform to another with varying levels of difficulty, while harnessed up. It's sure to be a popular addition to South Bend parks activities.

South Bend's splash pads—at Charles Black Recreation Center, Coquillard Park, Martin Luther King, Jr. Recreation Center, O'Brien Park, and Potawatomi Park, and Southeast Neighborhood Park—are free of charge and will be open seven days a week from 10 am to 7 pm seven until temperatures cool.

Potawatomi Pool is open until August 12. The hours are 12 to 6 pm Monday-Sunday, except Wednesdays when the hours are 2 to 8 pm. Kennedy Water Playground is open until August 7. Hours are 11 am to 5 pm, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday. Thursday hours are 1 to 7 pm and Sundays 12 to 5 pm.

Entrance fees for Potawatomi Pool and Kennedy Water Playground are \$4 for ages 3-17, \$5 for age 18 and older, and free for children under age 2. Kennedy Water Playground entry fees are discounted to \$2 for all patrons on Tuesdays and Sundays.

I hope everyone has had a wonderful summer taking advantage of all South Bend has to offer.

From the Office of the City Clerk

Although fireworks are not allowed within the city limits of South Bend for most of the year, consumer fireworks are allowed on private property July 1-9 between the hours of 5 to 11 pm. However, no person may use, ignite, or discharge consumer fireworks on any public street or in any public park within the City of South Bend at any time.

The City is asking people using fireworks to celebrate Independence Day to be mindful of South Bend's noise ordinance. Nuisance noise, flashes and loud bangs from fireworks can trigger frightened reactions and painful memories for some residents, especially those suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder.

The City also emphasizes that shooting fireworks outside of the allowed timeframe will be met with zero tolerance from law enforcement. Any person violating this ordinance shall be subject to the following penalties: \$100 for a first offense; \$250 for a second offense; and \$500 for a third offense and every subsequent offense.
