DIVERSE PUBLIC OPTIONS ARE CLASS ACTS

South Bend Community School Corp. serves an exceptionally diverse population of over 19,000 K-12 students. Some 3,500 employees contribute to the educational experience as teachers, administrators and support staff. With a budget of \$218 million to operate 34 school buildings and five support facilities in a geographic area covering 160 square miles, SBCSC is the fourth-largest school corporation in Indiana.

But the numbers, compelling as they are, tell only part of the story. While the sheer size and diversity of the South Bend Community School Corp. will inevitably present some challenges, there are also many features of South Bend schools — innovative programs, special awards, unique partnerships — that greatly enhance the quality of public education in our city.

YOU HAVE A CHOICE

SBCSC recognizes that every student learns at his or her own pace, so they strategically design classrooms and programs to provide a range of learning environments to best fit the student. Families may find that their neighborhood school is their school of choice. Or, they may find one of the magnet options appeals to their student's needs. In addition to a comprehensive curriculum, each of the four high schools offers a magnet program. There are also three magnet options for intermediate students in grades 5-8, and six options for students in kindergarten through grade 4.

Here's a closer look at some of the choices:

- 1. Adams High School** — Has an authorized International Baccalaureate Diploma magnet program. This is a rigorous course of study that provides students with the intellectual, social and critical perspectives necessary to succeed at colleges, both in the United States and abroad.
- 2. Clay High School** — Has an in depth Visual and Performing Arts magnet program intended to help students who are artistically, musically, theatrically and/or rhythmically talented and grow in knowledge, skill and the creative practice of their chosen art form in conjunction with a complete academic program.
- 3. Riley High School** — The engineering magnet is nationally certified as an Innovation High School through Project Lead the Way (PLTW). PLTW is the leading provider of rigorous and innovative Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) curricular programs in the United States. Students to earn up to 13 college credits and multiple scholarship opportunities only awarded to PLTW graduates.
- 4. Washington High School** — The Medical/Allied Health Sciences Magnet Program is designed as a four year college preparatory program, for students who want careers in health-care and other allied sciences. Students complete a science-oriented course of study, with specialized medical and health-related courses, as they pursue either Core 40 or Academic Honors Diploma. Health career job shadowing is offered to juniors and internship area of their choice senior year.
- 5. Kennedy Primary Academy (K-4) and LaSalle Intermediate Academy** — High ability students are able to apply to these schools which provide academic challenges beyond the Indiana Standards. Students learn in both guided and self-directed classwork. There is an emphasis on technology. Both have been designated National Blue Ribbon Schools by the U.S. Department of Education.
- 6. Perley Primary Fine Arts Academy (grades K-4) and Dickinson Intermediate Fine Arts Academy (grades 5-8)** — Offer students another choice. The self-esteem, self-discipline cooperation, self-motivation and skills of problem-solving and critical thinking developed as a result







7. Marquette Primary Montessori Academy is a member of the American Montessori Society (AMS) and a national Magnet School of Excellence. Their mission is to create a learning atmosphere of independence and freedom of choice that will help children learn to respect themselves, others and the environment; in turn producing productive, self-sufficient citizens. **Coquillard, Hamilton and Tarkington** (primary schools) and **Jefferson** (intermediate) — offer traditional schools. There is a strong emphasis on high academic standards, students' responsibility, appropriate conduct and active parent involvement in a structured, back-to-basics environment.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES

- SBSCS's Career and Technical Education (CTE) program teaches academic subject matter that is relevant to the real world. CTE offers 23 college and career pathways featuring hands-on, project-based instruction offering opportunities to earn dual high school credit as well as industry certification. The CTE courses are available to all juniors and seniors at any high school.
- In athletics, students can choose from some of the most popular individual and team sports. There are 10 different sports offered at the intermediate level and 19 offered at high school.
- Students also choose from an array of curricular and extra-curricular activities and clubs including newspaper, yearbooks, world languages, and community service and spirit clubs. Special interest groups range from robotics and chess, to ecology and education.
- For decades, SBSCS students have won numerous student science research awards, and two national Mock Trial championships.
- Graduates attend a variety of colleges and universities including Butler, DePauw, Duke, Earlham, Georgetown, Harvard, Loyola, Northwestern, Rose Hulman, University of Chicago, Notre Dame, Yale, and Wabash.
- Each primary center provides full-day kindergarten to offer students enhanced opportunities for academic preparation and social development.
- Studebaker Center provides early childhood classes for students in Head Start and SNAP (Special Needs and Abilities Preschool).
